The plan has insurance contracts with Aetna Life Insurance Co., UnitedHealthCare Insurance Company, Lincoln Life Assurance Company of Boston and Four Ever Life Ins Co to pay certain Dental, Vision, Life insurance, Accidental Death & Dismemberment, Stop loss, and Travel Assistance claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending December 31, 2019 were \$950,427.
